

WELCOME

Lounge

There is a lounge on the second floor of the Inn that has coffee, tea, mugs, wine glasses, books, games and puzzles that you are welcome to use.

Note: The room and lounge water from the tap is drinkable.

Please note that this is a public space and can be accessed by all. It is not for exclusive groups.



If you are gathering after the play, in the lounge, we ask that you be considerate of those who have adjoining rooms to the Inn. Please close both large doors.

Quiet time here at the Inn is from 10:30 pm - 7:00 am.

Key Cards

Please note that your key cards unlock both the front door and your room door. Your room door will lock automatically behind you after approximately 5 seconds.

If you find yourself locked out of the Inn, please ring the doorbell or call 403 677 2211.

Pie Shoppe & Eatery Hours

Open Wednesday-Saturday, 12:00pm - 4:30pm.

If you are looking for something for your day out, or an evening snack, ask about ordering a picnic lunch or a Charcuterie Board, featuring local products. Please allow for preparation time.


If you have large green pillows in your room, they are for the chairs outside.

Heat

You will see something like this on the wall in your room. (This controls the heating system and not the air conditioning)



There are 3 different settings. For setting the room to 15, press 'AWAY.' For setting the room to 19, press 'SLEEP.' For setting the room to 21, press 'HOME.'



* Please ensure windows and doors are closed before turning on air conditioning. *

If you will be gone from your room for an extended period of time (eg. to a theatre production), please turn off your air conditioner. We have an amazingly effective system, which will cool off your room in no time.

If it is going to be a cool night, please open your windows, as opposed to using the air conditioners.

To Turn on:

Use the 'MODE' button to set unit on 'Cool.' You will see this displayed on the left side of the screen. Point the controller at white box unit on the wall, then press the ON/OFF button. If you do not point your controller at the unit, it will not make the change in temperature.

Use the 'TEMP' button to change to the temperature you would like the room set at.

There is a small light on the unit. If you are sensitive to light at night, press the 'LED' button and this light will turn off.







HIKES, DRIVES & VIEWS

Orkney Viewpoint

"Orkney Viewpoint/Lookout is a natural lookout point, situated above the Red Deer River, located west of the community of Drumheller. The viewpoint lookout provides sweeping views of the Red Deer Valley."

From Drumheller, make your way to South Dinosaur trail W/ AB 575-W. Then turn right on AB-837 N. It is approximately a 15 min drive from Drumheller.



The Bleriot Ferry

The Bleriot Ferry only runs seasonally and is closed during the winter hours. It is a perfect detour that connects the roads that access the Horsethief Canyon and Orkney Viewpoint. Highway 838, Starland County, Alberta. -Travel Drumheller

Cross the Red Deer River on the cable-operated Bleriot Ferry. The free seven-minute ferry ride links the South and North sections of the Dinosaur Trail (Hwy 838) and is the perfect addition to a scenic road trip through Drumheller Valley in the Canadian Badlands. -Travel Alberta



Horseshoe Canyon

This U-shaped Canyon, which is where its name stems from, provides a great view and various trails. Make sure to bring water and sunscreen!

Located just off of Hwy 9 between Rosebud and Drumheller.



Horse Thief Canyon

A stunning viewing area across from Orkney Viewpoint on the other side of the river. If you are feeling adventurous, take a hike down on the trails in the canyon.

Drumheller Hoodoos

Unique landmarks formed by weathering and erosion.

A six kilometre stretch, over 11 one lane metal bridges, to the Hamlet of Wayne. If you brought a bike, try biking the stretch starting from the Rosedale outdoor skating rink. Be sure to stop at the historic Last Chance Saloon (Call for hours: 403 823 9189)






